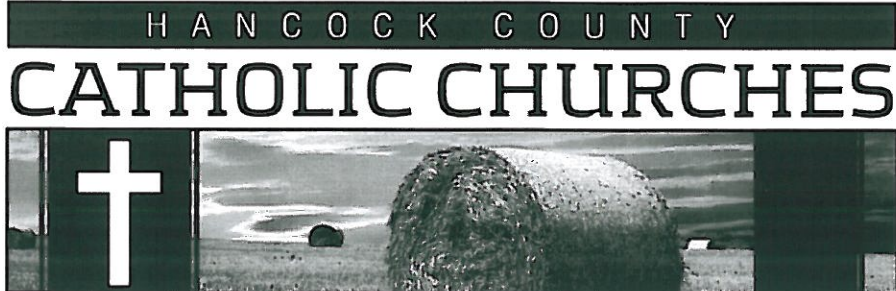

REDISCOVER NIGHTS RESUME ON SUNDAY, JANUARY 25TH.

The last Sunday in January is also the beginning of Catholic Schools Week this year. Besides the 8:00 a.m. Mass that begins the celebration of Catholic Schools Week on the Sunday morning of January 25th, we also resume our monthly "Rediscover Nights" that every evening. SPPS parents, you remember, don't you? The simple supper beginning at 5:00 p.m., followed by recreation for the kids - while you and our adult discussion leaders gather for discussion about our Catholic faith and the 7 Habits that are so much a part of our formation of leaders for Christ among our school children. The meal for you and your family is free (thank you St. James Knights of Columbus, Carthage, this month!), and the kids are under adult supervision during their recreation period. SHW – Quarterly Financial Report Here are a few things that we think you should know about our current financial situation:

- Except for the window repair (which cost \$28,000), our parish finances are \$1,200 in the black for the year
- We're holding initial discussions about interior church work. Before further decorating, we need to address repair of water damage – especially in the choir loft
- The ADA (not surprisingly) continues to lag. Our pledges are currently \$4,700 behind our parish goal. Any donations (above and beyond what you have already pledged) would be greatly appreciated.

Some Thoughts on the Sausage Breakfast It takes a whole bunch of people to make the breakfast happen – as you well know. It's an amazing event, which not only raises money for Sacred Heart, but also helps to bring us together as a community. For the future success of the breakfast – and in conversation with Mike and Diane Heisler, who have done quite a bit of organizing until now – we are going to be looking at expanding and diversifying our leadership roles for the breakfast. -Currently our fund for the parish hall stands at \$88,699.
-So far this year, our parish has taken in \$31,000 more than we've spent.
-We continue to lag significantly on the ADA. Our *pledges* are \$3,400 behind. Any further contributions would be greatly appreciated.

Feast of the Santo Nino de Cebu Because Immaculate Conception parish has more than a few Filipino parishioners, we thought it appropriate to recognize (albeit briefly) the upcoming Filipino feast of the Santo Nino de Cebu. The **Santo Nino de Cebu** is a title of Jesus associated with a vested statue of Him as an infant. It is the oldest religious Christian image in the Philippines, and was originally given in 1521 as a baptismal gift by Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan. His feast is liturgically celebrated every third Sunday of January, during which devotees carry a portable *Santo Nino* image onto the street fiesta dancing celebrations. So, Happy Feast Day to our Filipino parishioners! We hope you can celebrate in some way!
