REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDIUM

1. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.
2. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015, and all the Fridays of Lent.
3. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015, and Good Friday, April 3, 2015.
4. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
5. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the **Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe**. The collection offers a way for Catholics in the United States to stand in solidarity with those who experience the ongoing effects of living under communism.

Grants funded by the collection support pastoral projects, scholarships, and Catholic organizations working in areas formerly under Soviet control. The bishops and people of these regions still face enormous challenges in restoring church structures and in rebuilding the cultural and spiritual life of the community, tasks that are often complicated by a lack of religious freedom.

One funded group a Czech association for women and children and the protection of unborn life (*Obcanske sdruzeni ONZ-pomoc a poradenstvi pro zeny a divky*), has worked for 23 years to reduce the rate of abortions in the Czech Republic. When the association opened its doors in 1990 after the Velvet Revolution, half of all pregnancies in the country ended in abortion. Through innovative counseling and support programs at six regional centers for women in difficult situations, the association has played a major role in reducing the abortion rate from 50 percent down to 20 percent. The centers work to protect the human dignity of both mothers and children, advocating for the right to life of the unborn.

Recently, the association experienced a crisis when the Czech government withdrew operation support for its programs. The Subcommittee on the Church in Central and Eastern Europe provided a critical bridge grant that allowed the association to continue its operations while searching for a permanent funding solution. In 2014, the Czech Bishops' Conference announced that it would fund the association's operating expenses from its own budget, thereby guaranteeing the future of the association and its crucial work.

In order for projects like this one to continue, the collection needs your help. Please be generous. Your donation will continue to restore and build the future of the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. This collection will be taken up on Ash Wednesday. Thanks you and God bless you.

What Should I Do for Lent? Lent, as you know, is a time for Fasting, Prayer, and Almsgiving. It's a time for us, through these practices, to become more like Jesus in His suffering and death. If you're not sure what to do for prayer, you might want to check out the "Prayer/Sacraments" section on our web page (hancockcountycatholic.org) and go down to the section "How can I improve my daily prayer?" There you will find two prayer suggestions: the 5 Spiritual Means (you probably just want to choose 1) and the Daily Examen (a practice of the Jesuits - it's different than an "examination of conscience"). For almsgiving, you might want to pick up one of the rice bowls at the back of our churches, which support Catholic Relief Services. As for fasting: be creative. Consider what you really like, something you're really attached to (food, beverage, tv...), and then consider how you can set it aside (at least partially) in order to take up your cross.

When all is said and done, Lent is all about our becoming more like Jesus, and if we consider the love that he has shown us, our Lenten practices become so much more doable.

Prayerful Reading Group: Our next book is AHA! This will be the last book in the Kyle Idleman series. AHA stands for Awakening Honesty Action. Kyle takes us through the parable of the Prodigal Son. We take a look not only from the perspective of the Prodigal Son, but also from his father's and his brother's perspectives. Kyle shows us that like the Prodigal Son we can experience an aha! moment in our spiritual lives with everyday examples and testimonies. Join us on March 5th or March 7th as your schedule allows. I have ten books available so catch me after Mass or call me at 357-1016 to get a copy. Our book club meets once a month.
