IT'S GREAT TO BE BACK I returned from my trip to Rome early Wednesday morning, and by the time you are reading this, I think I will have fully recovered from jet lag! (I really understand what jet lag is, now.) It was a wonderful time! Still not too excited about flying there and back -- but being in Rome was a tremendous experience. For those of you who gave me your prayer intentions, please know that I offered them at Masses at the Casa Santa Maria, at the altars of St. Gregory the Great and St. Columban in St. Peter's Basilica, and at prayer in many basilicas and churches, among them: St. Paul Outside the Walls, Holy Apostles, St. Mark, St. Phillip Neri, St. Ignatius, the Jesu, St. Mary Major, St. Andrew, St. Nicholas, St. Clement, St. Mary of Mt. Carmel -- right now, I can't remember how many more churches I visited! I also offered prayer at the tombs of the popes of my lifetime, beginning with Pope Pius XII. The absolute highpoint was to be able to visit the convent church of St. Mary of the Holy Rosary (a Dominican Convent "chapel"), St. Sixtus, the church in Rome where St. Dominic began the community of Dominican Sisters in Rome, and St. Sabina, the church where St. Dominic established the Order of Preachers in 1221, a few months before he died. (St. Dominic is the all-time favorite saint for this guy.) The week was all mine; and morning, noon, and night, I walked everywhere. Might go back for the hot chocolate, too - good stuff! Now, let's get the stomach back in working condition and the sleep cycle back on track, and it's back to Lent in the USA. Fr. Tony
