VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR SUMMER MEALS PROGRAM CARTHAGE, IL – Carthage Community Development, in partnership with Memorial Hospital, will host a Summer Food Service Program for children ages pre-school through eighteen. The Summer Food Service Program was instituted to provide free nutritious meals to children during the summer months when school is not in session. No reservations are needed and there are no income restrictions. The children simply show up and eat. An educational activity precedes each day's meal. Persons over the age of 18 years who are enrolled in a state-approved educational program for the mentally or physically disabled are also eligible to eat. The Summer Food Service Program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture and administered by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Volunteers are needed to help make the Summer Meals Program a success. The program is scheduled Monday through Friday from June 8, 2015 through August 7, 2015. Volunteers work from 12:00 PM-1:00 PM and assist with serving the food to the children and cleaning up after the meal. Volunteers will be organized into teams and work two to three days per month. Volunteers must be a minimum of sixteen (16) years of age, and a background check may be required.
