**Reality and Idea** Last week, we applied a most basic Church teaching (almost a slogan), "Grace builds on nature," to show that the teaching of Jesus Christ taught by the Catholic Church against same-sex *simulation* of marriage (as well as *for* actual marriage between a man and a woman) is based on science, and therefore, is *not* removed from reality. The science stands on its own: the human reproductive system, woven into the life of every human being, itself "tells" you that the sex act is inseparably the bonding in love of a male-female couple and *at least* openness to children.

And yet (obviously) there *is* disagreement. Let's "take a look" at why the disagreement exists, at its source. From science, we move to philosophy.

Philosophy is the study of reality and of being; its quest is the truth, and for human beings, truth is conceptualized in ideas. Suddenly, a question arises: is truth a matter of lining up your ideas with reality; or is it a matter of lining up reality to fit your ideas – in effect, do your ideas make reality whatever you want it to be? The Catholic Church argues that truth is the conformity of your ideas to reality. With regard to the matter at hand, we teach that a man and a woman express the truth when their ideas *about* sex, orientation, and the emotion and arousal connected to it, are brought in line with what their reproductive system and the sex act, written in their very being, *tell* them both are. And fulfilling this truth brings the man and woman to fully realize *who they are*. Grace builds on nature; truth is conformity of the idea to the reality.

But people who are in favor of same-sex simulation of sexual relations and marriage are on the other side of the philosophical argument. They attempt to conform reality to *their idea* of what sex is, or should be. The reality of what the reproductive system *is*, what the sexual act *is*, and what it says about who they *are*, has to fit their idea of what sex needs to be *for them*. Sexual orientation, and the emotion and arousal connected to it, are now *the* reality to which what your body says about sex, and about you, has to bend. Grace builds on what you need nature to be, not what it is in itself; truth is conformity of the reality to the idea.

At the very root, there's your disagreement. And there's so much more to address: try conflicting realities, for instance. Be assured that we will! Next week: The Tale of Two Psychiatric Associations.

**TRAINING, COMMISSIONING, AND RENEWAL OF COMMISSIONING FOR EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION**

According to the statutes of the diocese of Peoria, the renewal of commissioning of extraordinary ministers of communion (formerly known as "Eucharistic Ministers") is supposed to take place every three years. And we're past that time when we last renewed the commitment of our communion ministers, or introduced new ones, for that matter. We ask all of the extraordinary ministers of holy communion in our churches to take note of the dates, times, and locations of these half-hour sessions which will present teaching on the Holy Eucharist, instructions on what to do in your ministry, and a brief rite of commissioning which will formalize your commitment to serve our churches in this important service. These sessions are for those who assist in the distribution of holy communion during Mass, and for those who bring holy communion to those who are not able to be with us at the celebration of the Eucharist.

**SUMMER MEALS PROGRAM CARTHAGE, IL** – Carthage Community Development, in partnership with Memorial Hospital, will host a Summer Food Service Program for children ages pre-school through eighteen. The Summer Food Service Program was instituted to provide free nutritious meals to children during the summer months when school is not in session. No reservations are needed and there are no income restrictions. The children simply show up and eat. An educational activity precedes each day's meal. Persons over the age of 18 years who are enrolled in a state-approved educational program for the mentally or physically disabled are also eligible to eat. The Summer Food Service Program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture and administered by the Illinois State Board of Education. The Summer Food Service Program is available to all eligible children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.
