So...What To Do? Perhaps you've caught the Xpedia commercial where, for a few seconds, two young men appear as a couple and one of them is carrying a baby. Or maybe the Wells Fargo commercial that closes with a happy young adopted girl being told of the greatest gift she's being given in two mommies. Now that same-sex simulation of marriage is the law of the land, how do you take a confident stand against it, especially when you find out that somebody in your family has same-sex attraction? Currently in the culture, if you don't approve of and agree with it, you're accused of hatred, fear (homophobia), rash judgment and slander ("gay bashing"), exclusion, and discrimination. Let's not forget one more thing: a superficial, unrealistic application of your Christian faith ("pray the gay away"). As a Catholic Christian, it's entirely possible, and even necessary, to disapprove and disagree, without hatred, fear, rash judgment, exclusion, discrimination, and with a proper application of your faith. You're not condemning a loved one because you disagree with same-sex simulation of sexual relations and marriage. And it isn't an act of love to go along with it. From the television and movies, right into your own home and family relationships: what do you do? Here's what to do:

First, keep an open door. Do not cut off ties. Do not banish from the home. Do not avoid the pain, the risk, the emotions, and the convictions. Do not avoid your family member's same-sex partner. Engage, confront all of this.

Second, hold to "My house, my rules; your house, your rules." In your home, you don't have to provide a bedroom for your family member and same-sex partner to sleep together during visits home. You don't have to allow the showing of affection that, because of your own deeply held beliefs, is the valid expression of an opposite-sex couple. And, while you can (should) speak out, you obviously cannot enforce your standards on the same-sex couple when they're on "their turf." If everybody is really the adult they claim to be, there should be enough of a sense of self to realize that much. You could well have to part for the night; but make it a point, on either side, to come back.

Third, encourage discussion. Listen. With every answer, probe with a further question. Make every effort and more to understand. Allow yourself to be challenged by what you hear. Invite people back to continue talking. Do not to pounce on people with a preconceived answer. True, your faith gives you one. But first, listen. Understand. But fourth....

Be sure to ask this: "Please explain how you face and confront yourself. Your mind, your will, your emotions, and your body are inseparable from their designs. And they can't come together in unity without respect for their designs. Your chosen behavior and lifestyle make that unity impossible. How do you explain that to yourself? Even to you, when nobody else is around, there's something you're trying to say with your body, that your body isn't designed to say. Doesn't that mean anything at all to you? How do you make sense of that?" Not just honesty with yourself; more, honesty with every dimension, every part of yourself. Be sure to ask that. Because when the deepest part of you is doing the talking, this is exactly what's at issue. Our conclusion, next week.
