So...Did Pope Francis Really Make Major Changes to Church Marriage Law? In short, the answer is "no." He did make some changes that will hopefully make the process faster. This has been one of the biggest critiques of the process, even though time is often necessary to perform a thorough investigation. So - no, the changes weren't "radical," and, no, the Pope has not permitted "Catholic divorce." It was a fine-tuning of the process that will hopefully make the process quicker.

AN UPDATE ON PASTORAL CARE VISITS We have completed the workshops for the commissioning of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for Mass and for those who are not able to come to Mass. (By the way, our next workshop will be for the renewal of commissioning of our lectors (readers) at Mass; that's still coming.) We are currently setting up a schedule to insure that Holy Communion can be brought to peoples' homes on a more predictable, reliable basis. In the meantime, here comes our annual reminder about your priests, your deacons, and pastoral care needs:

First, it's inevitable that we miss people. We have just as much going on in our lives as you do in yours, with the added dimension that emergencies, parish goals, and projects tend to run together and stall when pastoral care needs themselves run together and collide. When we make a commitment to be with people in their need, everything stops. Period. Things look messier, remain unfinished, and slow the pace around here. BUT WE HAVE ALWAYS FIGURED THAT BEING WITH PEOPLE IN HEALTH AND OTHER EMERGENCIES IS WHERE YOU WANT US TO BE. Therefore....

Second, help us out by letting us know about yourself or people that you know. Ask others you're wondering about whether they would want to see one of the priests or deacons, or have Holy Communion brought to them. If you think an approach would be worthwhile, but you don't think you're the one to make it, let us know and we'll make the approach.

Third, make it a point to tell your family to contact us. Many still don't realize that we cannot ask hospitals, and hospitals can no longer inform us, of your stay in a hospital unless you give specific permission to hospital staff - or you and your family contact us yourselves.

Finally...since usually some fallout we're trying to prevent actually occurs right after publishing a bulletin announcement like this...if anyone is upset over some perceived failure on our part when it comes to pastoral care needs....

Ask whether they've read the bulletin lately!! Fr. Tony.

RCIA: NEW BEGINNINGS. RCIA begins a new year of instruction and formation in the life of Jesus Christ and the Catholic faith today, this Sunday, September 13th. The first installment of RCIA begins at 5:00pm and concludes at 7:00pm. The advanced RCIA follows, beginning @7:00pm and concluding at 8:00pm. Our "RCIA Center" is in the Carthage Rectory. If you or anyone you know are still thinking about participating in RCIA but haven't contacted Fr. Tony yet, it isn't too late. Come on over, and we'll take care of registration during this opening session.

Youth Group - A New Name, A New Vision Our area high school youth group met for the first time this year...and for the first time with a new name: Christians In Action (aka CIA). There were a number of reasons why we decided to change the name: 1) We wanted to put a greater emphasis on the Person of Jesus - hence the name "CHRISTians In Action" as opposed to "Catholics In Action." The connection to Christ in "Heart Ministry" was sometimes lost. 2) We wanted to put a greater emphasis on service - hence "Christians In ACTION." People need to see Christians at work in the world, and we want our youth group to be a training ground for that. Our desire is that CIA will be a training ground for young Christian disciples, so you'll find us doing more service, more prayer, and (hopefully) less fundraising. So much time was spent on selling things...and not enough time was spent on learning how to be Christ. (Don't worry - we do have a plan in place to cover costs for our trip to Catholic Heart Workcamp.) So, that's where we're at - just wanted to keep you up to date!

It turns out, the same things—hopes, fears, ignorance, preconceptions—that tripped up Galileo and his opponents relate to what we face in explaining science and religion in our times. Brother Guy uses humor and simple discussion to explain; it really is not "rocket science." Many scripture passages and Saints' writings will be referenced as we continue this study. Our group DISCUSSION and sharing will be what makes it so valuable. Each lecture is about 25 minutes followed by discussion. We always have fun. Popcorn and tea or coffee will be provided.

Sharon is diabetic so she has some dietary restrictions. Her daughter suggests protein, vegetables, salads, etc. Please limit carbohydrates, pasta, sugar, desserts, and artificial sweeteners. If you wish to drop off a meal when it's hot and ready to eat, it works best with Sharon's medication to eat supper between 5 & 6 pm. Pre-cooked meals that need to be reheated or uncooked meals could be dropped off anytime with cooking instructions. Sharon's cell number is 217-357-1483 if you need to contact her prior to delivery or with questions about specific foods. Gift cards to local restaurants would also be acceptable. Thank you so much!!!
