October - the Month of the Rosary The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily because the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated every year on October 7th. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church when we pray the rosary. Contrary to what many may think, the Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. Pope Pius XII called the Rosary "a compendium of the entire Gospel, since it draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centered on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption. St. John Paul II called the Rosary his favorite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart. In this month of October, let's keep in mind that the Rosary is a means by which we can draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation - Jesus' Incarnation, Death, and Resurrection.
