Ministry Schedules - Calendar Issues This past weekend we encountered a difficulty we have from time to time: what happens when the Saturday is in one month, and the Sunday is in the month following? Here's our rule: **regardless of the month that the Saturday is in, the weekend will be considered the month of that Sunday.** So, for this past Saturday, if you were scheduled as a lector, usher, etc. for November, you were on the job...even though the date was October 31st. Hopefully this will help to take care of some confusion!

"We the Hancock County Catholic Churches Work Together..." About a month and a half ago, the members of all of our parish councils (finance, pastoral, education commission...) of all of our parishes got together for an evening of listening and discussion. One of the points of discussion was what sort of charitable work we could do as a group of churches. There are a lot of activities that we have within our churches, but we don't do a lot outside of them...and for the community at large. A number of different ideas were thrown out (including having a "Catholic Heart Workcamp" for Adults!), but the one that we are probably going to land on is a benefit to support the eleven food pantries of Hancock County. No details are set in stone at this stage (we're just beginning to form a committee to head it up), but I did want to let you know that this project is in the works. It gives us the opportunity to do a couple things: 1) Give charitably in a way that doesn't benefit us ("to labor and not seek reward," as St. Ignatius of Loyola would say) AND 2) Engage in a very easy form of evangelization. We may not convert anyone by our example, but at the very least, we can show that we Catholic Christians care about the community around us...and that's something that a lot of people don't realize.

SCRIP: Time to start thinking about shopping for that perfect gift for everyone on your list! *What better way to get started than by purchasing Scrip cards for all of your gift giving needs?* For SPPS school families, there will be a five-week Scrip contest to encourage sales during the holiday season. Each week, the classroom group (Pre-K; Kindergarten; 1st/2nd; 3rd/4th; 5th/6th) with the highest average sales will win the weekly contest. The contest will begin on November 16 and conclude on December 14. Be sure to mark the Scrip form(s) with the child's name to ensure his/her classroom receives credit.

Orders are due to the SPPS office Monday morning by 10 AM and will be available on Friday of the same week. In order to have cards back to you before Thanksgiving weekend shopping, all Scrip orders need to be received in the SPPS office by Thursday, November 19 at 10 AM.

NEW! NEW! NEW! Last year, during the holiday season, we raised over \$1,500 from Scrip contributions. Our goal this holiday season is to raise \$3,000 from Scrip contributions. Anything raised over \$1,500 will go towards the purchase of new Chrome book computers for the school. Each non-school family that purchases Scrip between November 1 and December 14 will be entered into a drawing for a \$50 Scrip card to the Scrip business of their choice. The more weeks you purchase Scrip (after Mass or Scrip order), the more times you are entered. Limit of one entry per week per family. Prize will be awarded in January.

There is good news if you have reached age 70 ½ and you would like to help your parish or school. **If you have an IRA**, the government requires you to take out a certain minimum amount each year and be subject to federal tax. However, the law allows you to donate this amount directly to your parish or school during 2015 and have it distributed free of federal income tax!
