We haven't had any major projects this half year, but there has been quite a little bit of little clean-up work being done - on trees and bushes and in the parish hall.

Mid-Year Financial Review Whether or not you've noticed, this has been a very active half-year for us. We've purchased a new bus for the school (\$25,000), put a new roof on our school (\$40,000, with half of the cost being covered by an insurance payment), and performed significant renovations on our school (transforming the cafeteria into a pre-k room, finishing our storage room so that it could be used for other purposes, making our bathrooms handicapped accessible). We are expecting that we are going to be putting a new roof on the church this year. We had thought it was going to be able to be put off a few years, but recent examinations have said otherwise. The cost for this will be in the range of \$85,000, but we have money for that in our capital campaign account.

Our New Residents at St. Joseph House I know that last week's announcement was a little bit thin on details - mainly because we weren't sure how it all was going to play out. But here's the basics of what's going on. Nauvoo's new Nurse Practitioner and staff member at the Medical Clinic, Tony Wasielewski is the new resident at St. Joseph House along with his wife and children. (They're Catholics, and their children are enrolled in our school.) They've moved to Nauvoo from Troy, Missouri, and have been diligently looking for a home...but have had a hard time finding one...and a hard time finding a house to rent. So, after conversations between us and them...and us and the diocese...we'll be renting St. Joseph House to them until they find a new home to buy or to build. All in all, it's a win-win situation. St. Joseph House hasn't been getting a lot of use, and we're able to offer its use to someone in need of a place to live/rent. Tony, Barb, and family - we're glad to have you here!
