#### **CANDLELIGHT MASS FOR THE DEAD THIS COMING FRIDAY**

After last Friday's evening Stations of the Cross and Mass at SHDC with the Sacred Anointing of the Sick, we look forward to SSPP's turn at hosting the Stations of the Cross and Mass - this time, with the celebration of the Candlelight Mass for the Dead. We really hope the attendance and participation is good, because the display of candles representing the faithful departed in the sanctuary is deeply moving and consoling. Here are some reminders about how things will go next Friday evening. First, when you come to church with your candle (with stand or holder, and identification so that you can take yours back home), keep the candle with you. Don't bring it up to the sanctuary right away; you'll be able to do that, later, during Mass. Second, we'll pray the Stations of the Cross as we usually do. Third, we will celebrate the Mass for Friday of the First Week of Lent. Fourth, after the sermon, you'll be invited forward to bring your candle to the sanctuary. Helpers will be available to take your candle and place it on the altar, or a few tables that will be situated around the altar in the sanctuary. After we light the candles, all lights will be dimmed (with perhaps one left on, to guarantee safety when coming forward for Communion a little later). The Mass continues, with basic chant for the Mass parts. When Mass is finished, you may come forward to pick up your candle and take it home with you. In advance, a "thank you" for those who will be a part of this liturgy. Our belief in the communion of saints, and their presence with us in Christ at every Mass, is wonderfully symbolized with the candles shining brightly around the altar. "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses...." Hope to see you there - and then we'll all go over and have some fish! Fr. Tony

#### **LENTEN SERIES ON INDULGENCES: AN INTRODUCTION**

Beginning this week, through the publication of our weekly church bulletin, we're going to give a careful, step-by-step explanation of the practice and the mystery of indulgences. The Jubilee Year of Mercy gives us an opportunity to re-learn and renew our faith when it comes to indulgences - and get past any misunderstanding about what they really are, or how they've been abused in the history of the Catholic Church. You will find a copy of the brochure that Fr. Szydlak put together for Sts. Peter and Paul inserted in the bulletin this week. His explanation of the plenary indulgence and the steps involved in its practice is excellent in its content and precision. We'll be using it as an outline in this bulletin series. For this weekend, let's briefly stress a few points. First, indulgences are not magic acts, and were never taught to be such in the official teaching of the Catholic Church. Second, because they're not magic acts, you can't buy one! And you shouldn't have been able to buy one in Martin Luther's time, either! (Much more on that one, in coming installments!) An indulgence is an opportunity to participate in God's purification of a soul for the completion of that soul's journey to heaven. Yes: you and I are invited by God to be a type of partner in His work, and to even direct the power of prayer for the intention of a particular soul in order to complete the soul's disposition to receive the vision of God in heaven. We'll explain all this, and even more, in the coming weeks. So please be patient, and learn step by step about a most powerful way to mature spiritually and be an intercessor, an instrument, a partner of God in the work of the salvation of souls.

**How often may I receive an Indulgence?**

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day.

**Do I have to go to Confession every day that I receive a Plenary Indulgence?**

No. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.



**Other than pilgrimage, what are some ways I can participate in the Year of Mercy?**

Consider taking a look at your life and whether you can better practice the *Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy*.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are:

- To feed the hungry;
- To give drink to the thirsty;
- To clothe the naked;
- To shelter the homeless;
- To visit the sick;
- To visit the imprisoned;
- To bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are:

- To instruct the ignorant ;
- To counsel the doubtful ;
- To admonish sinners ;
- To bear wrongs patiently;
- To forgive injuries;
- To comfort the afflicted;
- To pray for the living and the dead.

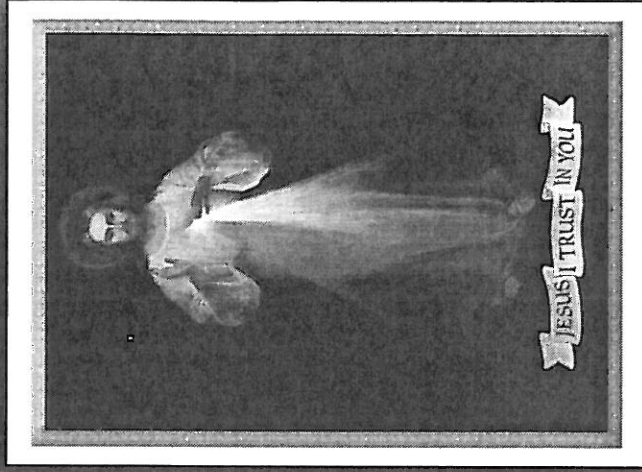
You could also consider praying regularly the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

# An Explanation of the Year of Mercy

### What is the Jubilee Year of Mercy?

Pope Francis established this "Year of Mercy" as a time when we can remember the closeness of God and encourage reconciliation with Him and with each other. He has especially asked Catholic Christians to engage in works of mercy throughout this year as a means to show the Father's love to the world.

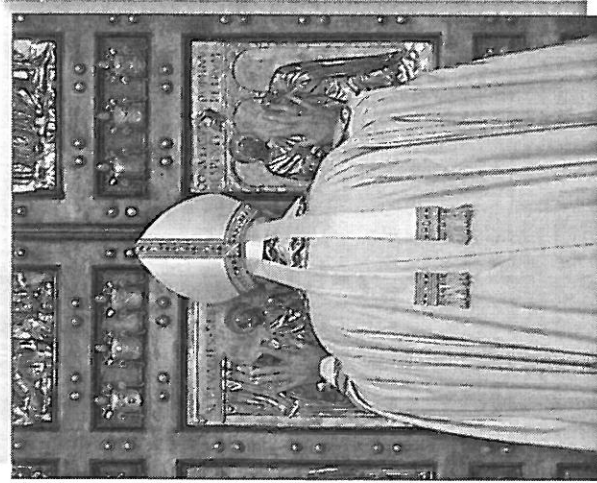
### What is the Purpose of a Holy Door?

For the last 700 years, the Catholic Church has regularly celebrated "Holy Years" (*usually* every twenty-five years). A major element of each Holy Year has been the holy doors - which are found in the larger churches in Rome but also in churches throughout the world. This churches become sites of pilgrimage and prayer during the Holy Years.

A symbolic act performed by each pilgrim has been a passing through the Holy Door. Pope John Paul II stated that the Holy Door "....evokes the passage from sin to grace which every Christian is called to accomplish. Jesus said, 'I am the door' (John 10:7) in order to make it clear that no one can come to the Father except through Him. This designation which Jesus applies to Himself testifies to the fact that He alone is the Savior sent by the Father. There is only one way that opens wide the entrance into this life of communion with God:

This is Jesus, the one and absolute way to salvation.

So, when pilgrims pass through the Holy Door, they are symbolically committing themselves once again to follow Christ and to entrust their salvation to Him. Passing through a Holy Door also offers the opportunity for receiving an *indulgence* for oneself or for someone who has died.



### What is an Indulgence?

An *indulgence* is the remission, by the merits of Jesus Christ of the temporal punishment due to sins that have been sacramentally forgiven (through Confession).

A *plenary indulgence* means that the *full* remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes *as if just baptized* and would fly immediately to heaven if he died in that instant (that is, they would not need to experience a purification in purgatory). A *partial indulgence* means that a portion of the temporal punishment due to forgiven sin is remitted.

Indulgences *can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased*, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

### What must I do to receive a Plenary Indulgence?

Along with performing the indulgenced work (in this case, passing through the holy door), the pilgrim must fulfill the following conditions:

- + Be in the *state of grace* at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed. [i.e. one must be a Catholic, not excommunicated or in schism.]
- + Have the interior disposition of *complete detachment from sin, even venial sin*
- + *Have sacramentally confessed* their sins
- + *Receive Holy Communion*
- + *Pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff* (an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested.)

**GUIDELINES FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDIUM**

1. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.
2. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015, and all the Fridays of Lent.
3. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015, and Good Friday, April 3, 2015.
4. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
5. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.
